

NCJW/Cleveland's 'Culinary Cleveland: Three Chefs, Three Visions'

Award-winning Cleveland chefs Richard Soren Arnoldi, Chris Hodgson and Doug Katz offered insight into their culinary visions at "Culinary Cleveland: Three Chefs, Three Visions" at the winter meeting of National Council of Jewish Women/Cleveland Feb. 10 at Executive Caterers at Landerhaven in Mayfield Heights.

The chefs discussed the culinary scene in Cleveland – its past, present and continued growth, with emphasis on their own journeys, their visions and the future of cuisine in Cleveland. The event drew 350 people.

Arnoldi has been executive chef at The Ritz-Carlton, Cleveland, since 2009. Hodgson's food truck, Dim and Den Sum, gained a cult following and helped pave the way for Cleveland's food truck culture.

Katz is the owner and executive chef of fire food and drink at Shaker Square, owner of The Katz Club Pop Up Diner in

Cleveland Heights and chef/partner of Provenance, Provenance Cafe and Catering By Provenance at the Cleveland Museum of Art.
